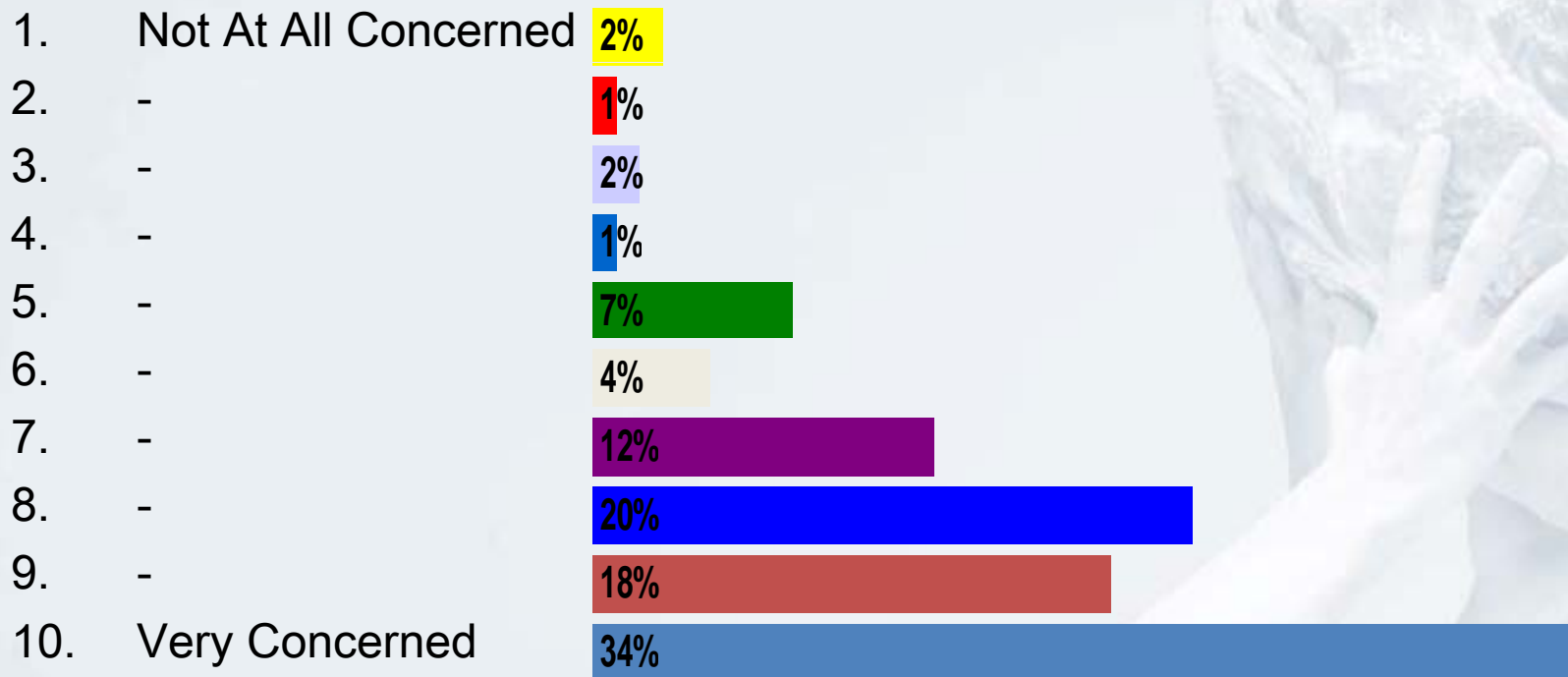

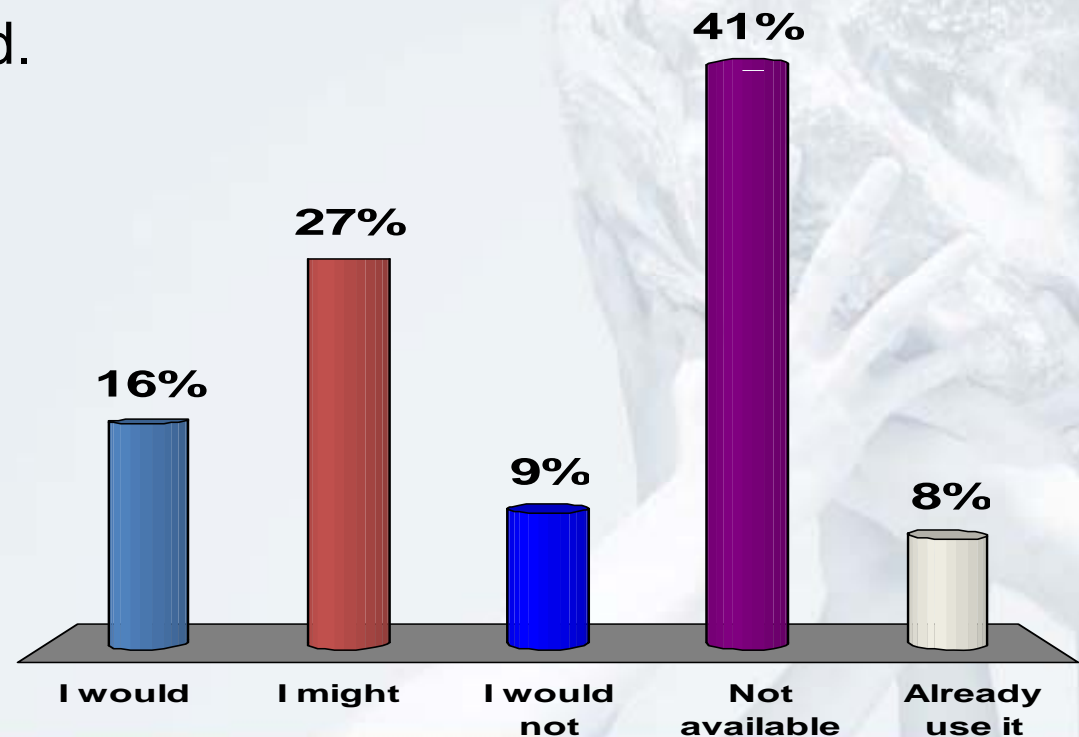
Please indicate on a scale from 1 to 10 how concerned you are about our air pollution in Maricopa County.

If you were convinced automobiles caused air pollution that was impacting your health, and that of your families' and neighbors', how likely would you be to take public transit more often?

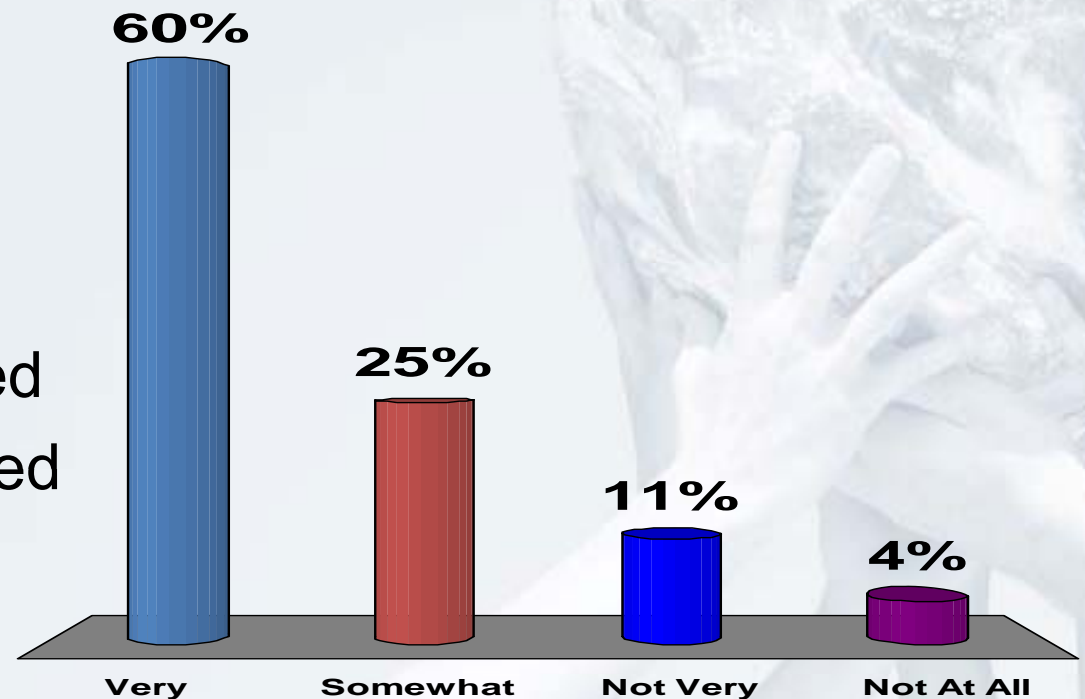
1. Yes I definitely would.

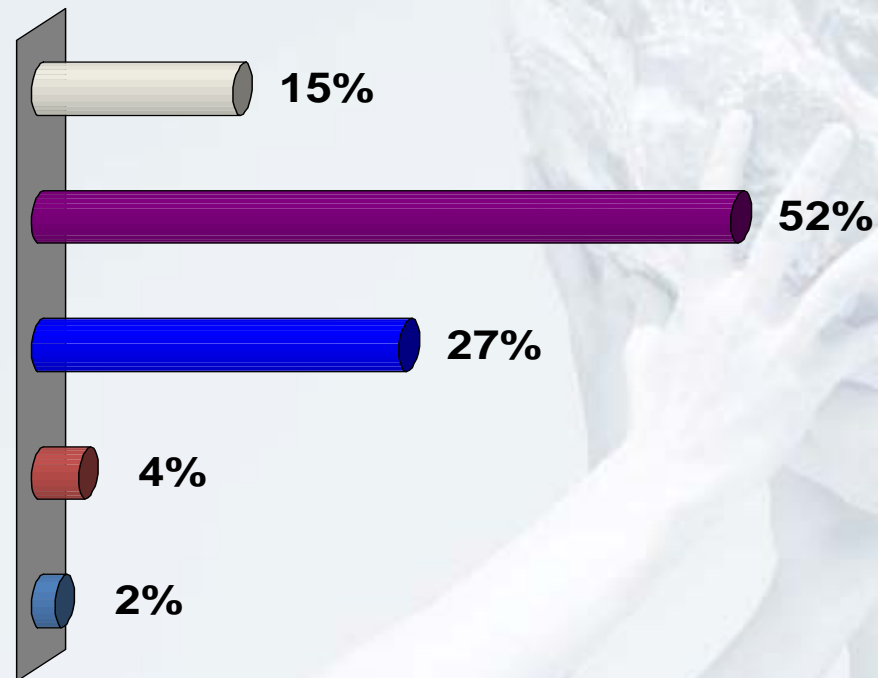

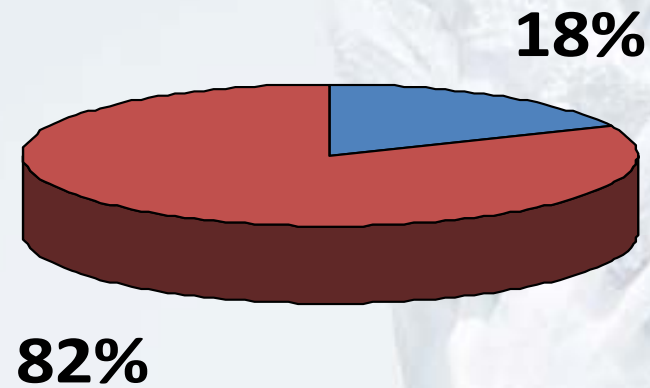
